Redondo for Residents First

- Focus on needs of residents FIRST – primarily to be left alone to raise our families and live our lives as we see fit without unnecessary and unwanted encumbrances or inconveniences being imposed upon us
- Increase and maintain the needs of residents, their safety, streets, parks, schools and quality of life as the highest priority in the city
- City to support resident-friendly and patriotic city events (i.e. Memorial Day Parade)
- Enhance (not take away) our City's once beautiful and rich historical landmarks that are now diminishing, going into disrepair or being used for non-residential usage (i.e., Veteran's Park Memorial; Vincent Park; the Pier, our beaches)
- Demand that city council members treat residents with respect and human dignity
- Honor a "Resident of the Year" (men and women who volunteer and sacrifice their time and lives to make Redondo a better place to live, without personal gain)

Taxes

- No increase or alterations in assessments without public notice and notice to each resident
- Or, in the alternative, no assessments without the voter's approval
- Assure proper allocation of our money by the City (i.e. no high paid "consultants" for business development projects when our residential streets and sidewalks are in disrepair)

Public Safety

- Increase Police, Firemen and Parking Enforcement Personnel
- New Police and Fire stations; improved equipment
- Fair contract and pay for Police and Fire Departments
- Minimizing obstruction of residential vehicular access during public events (i.e. no closing off streets and not allowing residents in and out by motor vehicle even when it is safe to do so). Also, moratorium on any more events on South Redondo streets
- Allocation of all necessary resources and personnel of police and parking enforcement to take care of traffic flow and control
- Enforce our laws! No littering, tents, or open fires in parks, no running stop signs (that goes for bicyclists too), no speeding, especially on residential streets, no excessive noise (loud mufflers, etc.) from cars, trucks and motorcycles
- Better school security and closed campuses
- Decrease traffic on residential streets and better traffic flow patterns within the city
- Provide resources for parking and traffic flow planning during open events within the city that don't affect residents' property and safety and residents' enjoyment of same events

Maintenance

- City to return to maintaining public property without levying additional taxes on residents: Examples: Sewers, sidewalks, parks, streets, beaches, trees, lights (residents pay appx. 80% of the city's revenue already)
- Strictly enforce litter laws, especially on the pier and in Veterans Park
- Improve our schools
- Clean up our beaches and water

Resident Friendly Density Control

- Moratorium on increased density
- Absolutely no taking residential property by eminent domain
